Current situation:

Going concern.

- 3 year contract with NDHB (to 30 June 2018)
- 53 staff
- 2014 annual income = \$2.581M. Surplus \$158k before capital exp
- In the bank = \$875K. Assets (fixed) \$184K
- Lease 3 buildings from Parihaka Property Trust, 5 from private landlords and 1 from DHB
- Currently have 29 vehicles, 13 desk computers and 3 lap tops

Current situation (Continued):


- Completely funded dependent on DHB funding.
 - We have no external \$\$ resources.
 - Opportunity we have is to use DHB \$\$ to do Christian purpose.
 - Can we do that wider? Of course, if we can make it viable.


Agency Vision and Purpose

Issues we face:

- Governance
 - Directors. Enuf? Skill sets? Vision for AML? Expansion ideas?
 - Retirements:
 - Chair Peter Jensen retiring November 2015
 - CEO Robert retiring Dec 2016
- Finances:
 - No new funding from Govt.
 - No price increases 6 years. Staff only 1% pay rise in 2015. Effect: 10% pay cut!
 - Keep \$\$ surplus for future "fighting fund".
- Staffing:
 - CEO replacement
 - Senior staff at retirement age
- Increasing complexity. Our high needs residential has 50% of referrals direct from Ngawha Prison.

Strategies for Future:

- Church strategy to identify, train new leaders, trustees, governors, elders?
- Arataki and Church: consider future of Arataki to guide new CEO election:
 - Align with Church purpose and vision, engagement in Church management team.
 - CEO to be a WCBC church member?
 - CEO to be clinician or a people manager?
 - We have a great deputy (Catholic), but is she interested in CEO position?
- What goals do we see for Arataki over next 5 years. Current:
 - stick close to "our community" Whangarei.
 - stick to our "knitting" mental health and addictions
 - look at options when they come along.
- Or, do we become more aggressive and grow the business.
 - Social Housing?
 - Or collaborate more with other local churches/social agencies: "one stop shop"?

Possible styles of Social Action and Evangelism:

- There are various ways in which people practice the healing gift:
- Mercy. Jesus went to the one. Giving. Seen in aid organisations and Govt aid.
- <u>Empowerment</u> worked <u>with</u> rather than <u>did to</u>. Strength based. *Seen in some aid organisations and Govt funded care.*
- Healing/Power prayer and miraculous healing. Pentecostal style.
- <u>Protest and social action</u> Jesus the trouble maker! *Protesters. Seen in Christian left.*
- <u>Present</u> <u>being there</u> offering solace. *Seen in the Ghandi or Mother Therese and some Catholic contexts*.
- <u>Evangelism</u> Jesus proclaimed "Sin no more. Come to me". *Seen in traditional Baptist Church/Billy Graham*.
